A: When you donate to the Annual Fund, half the money you donate to District 6000 three days later is used for our Rotary Clubs, Global Grants, and Global Scholarships. The rest remains for The Rotary Foundation to provide matching funds for Global Grants. No charity or other organizations can apply to your Rotary Foundations for funds. No board of trustees looks at the money and decides how to distribute it. Gifts to the Annual Fund, also known as SHARE, are the primary source of funding for a broad range of local and international grants that change lives.
